RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **“EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.”**
2. The processing fee of \$80.00 will not be deducted from the entry fees. There will be no post entry fee charged except where otherwise noted.
3. Change of Entries: When an exhibitor wishes to make a change of entries in any class he is required to follow the proper procedure of scratching the existing entry and making a new entry with the Show Secretary's office. NOTE: EQUITATION HORSES any horse ridden in any equitation class must be properly named on the entry form. Any change of horse MUST be recorded on the entry form by the Secretary prior to the start of the class.
4. Refunds: Before the closing date of entries, all fees will be returned minus a \$80.00 service fee. After the closing date of entries, with a Doctor's or Veterinarian's Certificate, stating reason for cancellation, approved refunds minus a \$125.00 service fee and a \$180.00 stall fee. The balance remaining will be refunded within thirty days after the Horse Show.
5. A penalty of \$50.00 must be paid if a check is refused by the bank for any reason. No check may be processed a second time, but must then be covered by money order, cashier's check or cash.
6. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to decline any entry fee without explanation, or to remove any animal from the show and return its fees (except in case of violation of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. or Show Rules) without being liable for compensation to the exhibitor or owner of the horse. The committee also reserves the right to change the location of any class, to cancel or combine any class having less than four entries, and to change the show schedule as it deems necessary.
7. For horse show purposes, the age of a junior exhibitor on December 1st shall be maintained throughout the ensuing year. When classes are divided by age, no horse shall compete in more than one age group; this applies to performance classes where the horse is being judged regardless of division, but not to equitation classes where the rider is being judged.
8. **ATTENTION EXHIBITORS:** All horses competing in United States Equestrian Federation non-breed restricted licensed competitions with Hunter, Hunter Breeding, Pony Hunter Breeding, Jumper and Hunter Seat Equitation classes (except those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9) must be properly identified and must obtain a registration number from USHJA. A registration number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for USEF licensed competitions. Only one registration number will be issued per horse and must remain with the horse throughout its career. Registrations can be completed on-line by visiting www.ushja.org or www.usef.org, by completing and submitting a registration application in the show office or by submitting an application to USHJA. USHJA Registration Fee: \$30.00.
9. When filling out your entry form care should be taken to enter each horse in its proper division or class. Exhibitors are responsible for their errors and those of their agents in making out entry forms. In all cases, the description on the entry form must fully identify the horse. The word "entry" shall not be accepted. All entry forms must be filled out COMPLETELY. To be complete entry forms must include: 1) Full payment for entry fees, stall fees and miscellaneous fees 2) Horses' names and complete description 3) All classes or divisions entered 4) All MANDATORY SIGNATURES 5) Organization MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS 6) Required addresses and phone numbers. By completely filling out your entry form it will speed up the process in the horse show office when you come to pick up your exhibitor number.
10. No child's entry will be accepted unless the entry form is signed by a parent or guardian; the signature of an instructor, agent or other unrelated person will not be acceptable.
11. Membership cards and Pony and Junior Hunter measurement cards must be presented at the Horse Show Office before numbers can be picked up. Please send a photostat copy of your cards with your entries.
12. **ASSUMPTION OF RISK, HOLD HARMLESS, INDEMNIFICATION, AND RELEASE AGREEMENT.** Recognizing and agreeing that horse sports and horse-related activities may be DANGEROUS AND HAZARDOUS ENDEAVORS, EVEN LEADING TO PERMANENT INJURY OR DEATH, each owner, rider, spectator, or other participant and/or parent or legal guardian of an owner, rider, spectator or other participant (collectively "owner") expressly ASSUMES ANY AND ALL RISKS of any loss, damage, or bodily injury and AGREES TO HOLD HARMLESS, REGARDLESS OF NEGLIGENT ACTS OR OMISSIONS, the Flintridge Riding Club, the Flintridge La Canada Guild of Huntington Memorial Hospital ("Guild"), the Pacific Coast Horse Shows Association ("PCHA"), and its organizing committee, their respective directors, members, agents, and employees, and any instructor or contractor of the Flintridge Riding Club, and his or her employees, or employees thereof (collectively "Show"). Each owner shall be responsible for any loss, damage, or bodily injury that may be occasioned to any person by any horse exhibited; and each owner shall INDEMNIFY the show against all claims or demands of any nature that may grow out of any loss, damage, or bodily injury occasioned by a horse exhibited or arise from the negligence of the person(s) in charge of each horse. In addition to the above ASSUMPTION OF RISK, HOLD HARMLESS and INDEMNIFICATION, each owner, rider, spectator, or other participant and/or each parent or legal guardian of an owner, rider, spectator or other participant knowingly and expressly RELEASES the Show and the Guild of ANY ACTS OF NEGLIGENCE, WHETHER ACTIVE OR PASSIVE. This ASSUMPTION OF RISK, HOLD HARMLESS, INDEMNIFICATION, AND RELEASE shall include the payment of any attorney's fees, and shall include reimbursement to the Show and the Guild arising out of any loss, damage, or bodily injury occasioned by the owner, including any guest, relative, minor children, or wards thereof, from any cause whatsoever, REGARDLESS OF PASSIVE OR ACTIVE ACTS OF NEGLIGENCE of the Show. This ASSUMPTION OF RISK, HOLD HARMLESS, INDEMNIFICATION, AND RELEASE WAIVES AND RELEASES VALUABLE LEGAL RIGHTS.
13. In Junior Jumper, Junior Hunter and Pony Hunter, if there are 50 or more entries in an age group at the beginning of the first class, it will be divided by age and the prize money will be doubled. If the division by age is not equitable, the sections will be chosen by taking every other one on the class list. In all other classes but medals and teams, if there are 40 or more entries, the classes will be divided. Exception in the Short and Long Stirrup Divisions classes will be divided at management's discretion.
14. Schooling Fences. Fences in the schooling and warm-up areas shall be flagged and must be jumped in the proper direction (white on the left, red on the right).
15. GR801 Dress. "2. It is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, and Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering

the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. 3. Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, all juniors riding in Hunter, Jumper and Hunter Seat Equitation sections, and all sub-juniors riding in the Paso Fino division, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place."

16. In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
17. Equine Drug Testing at the Flintridge Children's Horse Show is conducted under the auspices of the State of California Department of Food and Agriculture and United States Equestrian Federation, Inc.
18. Sharps and Medical waste must be placed in the proper receptacles provided by the horse show. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine or other penalties deemed necessary by show management.
19. Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100.00. Management reserves the right to call Animal Control to have an animal removed from the premises.
20. Should any question or dispute not provided for arise, it shall be referred to the Horse Show Committee whose decision shall be final.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NONMEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30 NONMEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES. (See GR828.4 of the Federation Rules).

From the PCHA: "All owners, riders, handlers, and trainers who exhibit or participate in PCHA-approved shows must be members of the PCHA or pay a \$10.00 non-member fee (hunter/jumper shows) or a \$5.00 non-member fee (for Western shows.) \$3.00 per horse for each numbered horse that is entered in a Hunter Jumper, Equitation, Pony (H/S) Show and \$3.00 per horse for each numbered horse that is in a Western Show.

RING INFORMATION:

All rings are composed of sand. The dimensions are estimated at Jimmy Williams Oval-286 ft. length and 127 ft. wide, Ring 2-230 ft. length, corners 134 ft., 118 ft. wide. Upper Ring-60 meters length, 25 meters width.

STABLING FEE: \$180.00

Portable stalls of metal and canvas construction, with stall doors under canvas. However, we cannot guarantee stabling for post entries, and we recommend that your entries be received before the closing date. Stalls are available only for horses entered at this horse show. The show office handles all stall transactions and charges. Private transactions involving stalls are not permitted. Management reserves the right to limit tack stalls. Stall fees are not refundable after entry closing date unless all stalls are sold and the canceled stall can be re-sold to another competitor on the waiting list by the horse show office.

STALLS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT NOON ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 28TH. EARLIER ARRIVAL NOT PERMITTED.

All stalls must be vacated by 8:00 a.m., Monday, MAY 3RD.

Trucks and trailers will enter the Club grounds through gate "3" on Oak Grove Drive, north of the main gate. There will be no exceptions to this rule. There will be limited automobile parking space at gate "3". Additional parking is available in the parking lot at gate "1" on Foothill Blvd. on the south side of the Club grounds.

CAMPER PARKING FEE: \$300.00

A limited number of reserved spaces for motor homes and campers will be available for the duration of the Show. Reservations must be included on the Official Entry Form. NO HOOKUPS (ELECTRIC OR WATER) AVAILABLE!!

FOOD

Food will be served in the food court starting Thursday morning.

AWARDS

Trophy to First Place, Ribbons through tenth place, Short and Long Stirrup Divisions, these classes will be divided at management's discretion.

Trophy to First Place, Ribbons through eighth place in all Classes, except where otherwise noted.

Perpetual Trophies remain in possession of the Flintridge Riding Club.

Prize money paid to 6th Place: 30%, 22%, 15%, 12%, 11%, 10%, except where otherwise noted.

Premium and Refund checks will be mailed out thirty days after the Horse Show. No prize money checks will be mailed unless the owner's social security number or tax I.D. is listed on the entry form.

WARM-UP CLASSES

Entry Fee: \$30.00 per round.

The WARM-UP CLASSES are open to all horses/ponies as an opportunity to school over the show jumps. At no other time will schooling be allowed over these jumps. Attire may be informal-boots and breeches or heavy shoes with a distinct heel (no tennis shoes or desert boot) and chaps. Hunt coats are not required, but protective headgear is **MANDATORY**. Horses will not be judged. The ticket system will be used. Tickets must be presented to the gate person for warm-up rounds. **Please note there are no refunds or credits for warm-up tickets so please only purchase the amount of warm-up tickets that you will use!**

SHORT AND LONG STIRRUP DIVISION

Entry Fee For Division: \$315.00. Individual classes may be entered at \$50.00 per class.

Open to riders 11 and under, 12 through 14, 15 through 17 years of age who have never competed in classes over fences exceeding 3' in height. Horses and ponies are eligible. Riders in this division may not show in any other classes with fences over 3' in height although the horses and/or ponies MAY be ridden by someone else in other classes. Equitation classes are to be judged on seat, hands, legs, control of mount, and suitability. All hunter classes and pleasure classes will be judged on performance, soundness, and suitability with emphasis on manners unless otherwise noted. Each of the Stirrup Division Sections must have a minimum of four (4) exhibitors in order to remain split. Fences 2'. Not rated.

To be eligible, a horse must have been entered, shown and judged in at least two classes over fences in the Short and Long (Section I and Section II) Stirrup Division. Fences 2'. Designated classes 6, 13, 20 will be counted as the first round of the Classic, each round to count 50%. At least the top 12, if available, or 25% of the first round entries will return over a second course. Adjustment of \$27.50 will be made if exhibitor does not qualify for the classic.
